

Schynige Platte – Top of Swiss Tradition.

Guests visiting the Schynige Platte at 1,967 metres (6,450 feet) altitude by cog railway feel carried back to the “Belle Époque”. This one and only nostalgia railway of its kind in Switzerland negotiates the stretch of seven kilometres (4.3 miles) in 52 minutes. The wooden benches in the train coaches and the rolling stock dating from the 19th century are reminiscent of a bygone era and the pioneer spirit of the Bernese Oberland.

Top attractions

- Perfect panorama view including Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau as well as Lakes Thun and Brienz.
- Free admission to Botanic Alpine Garden with roughly 650 plant species.
- Daily musical entertainment by Alphorn blowers.
- New walking tour “Four Elements Path” on Schynige Platte.
- Mountain hotel with restaurant and spacious sun terrace.

Good to know

- Operates daily from 30 May to 27 October 2019.
- Arrival: by train from Interlaken Ost to Wilderswil, change to cog railway; Schynige Platte railway leaves from Wilderswil every 40 minutes (07.25h to 16.45h).
- Nature cinema and small railway exhibition inside Schynige Platte station.
- Accommodation as in Granny’s days in the mountain hotel Schynige Platte.
- Barbecue area and comfortable panorama circular walks (0.5 to 2.5 hours).
- Nostalgic steam rides: Operation dates at jungfrau.ch/dampf-fahrten, steam surcharge applies additionally to valid ticket (available online at jungfrau.ch or at the stations of Jungfrau Railways).
- Tip: hike from Schynige Platte to intermediate station Breitlauenen, coffee and cake at the small and authentic buffet of Breitlauenen (space limited).



Sales information

- Holders of a Swiss Travel Pass, a Swiss Travel Pass Flex (on validated travel days) or a Swiss Half Fare Card are eligible for a 50% discount.
- Children from their 6th up to their 16th birthday travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent with the Swiss Family Card.
