

Train and bike. A combination for adventurers.

Enriching the bike experience with a boat ride? Via train back to square one? The possibilities for combinations are endless – turning public transport in Switzerland into so much more than just transportation.

Planning your train-and-bike adventure.



Public transport is perfectly fit for cyclers and mountain bikers. At more than 300 railway stations, neat [SwissMobil info boards](#) facilitate the access to every bike route. In order to help with the planning of outdoor activities, all routes are linked to the timetable at [schweizmobil.ch](#). It combines all available information about the precisely tuned connections of more than 150 transportation companies in Switzerland. Also to be found is a wealth of useful tips for the outward and return journey by public transport, plus information about practical services available on the train and at the railway station. Updated daily and only a mouse click away.

Individual bicycle transport within Switzerland.



Switzerland is a genuine paradise for cyclers. Bicycles can be handily transported by train or bus. Within Switzerland, bicycles can be taken along on many SBB trains and private railways as well as PostBuses (valid ticket required). The respective coaches and buses are marked with a cycle pictogram. In the SBB online timetable under “Advanced Search” the option “Carriage of bicycles required (Switzerland only)” can be selected, which shows all connections where individual bicycle transport is possible.

Shipping bicycles in Switzerland as luggage.



Within Switzerland, bicycles can be handed over and collected at any railway station with a luggage counter. Bicycles handed over before 19.00h can be collected the day after the next from 09.00h in the morning. It is important to check the individual opening hours of luggage counters. For groups of more than 10 persons, at least 5 days of advanced notification before departure is required.

Combining rent-a-bicycle and railway adventure.



Leisure travellers who don't want to take their bike along or don't own one can rent a bicycle in Switzerland. Many railway stations offer rental services for bicycles, e-bikes and mountain bikes. Renting at one place and returning at another – namely at one out of some 200 “rent-a-bike” stations in Switzerland ([80 of which are located at railway stations](#)): That way, everyone may combine train and bike according to his or her individual need and gusto.
