

# Travelling by train from Austria.

With the comfortable Railjet or the Eurocity trains, travellers arrive in Zurich daily at two-hour intervals. Perfect onward connections to all Swiss regions are guaranteed. Even better: the Nightjet links Vienna to Zurich “in sleep mode”, so to speak.

## Ticket range Railjet

Standard fare (Presale: 180 days prior to departure date)

- Full flexibility (free choice of train)
- Seat reservation not included but available and recommended (included in Business Class)



**Saver fare** (Presale: 180 days prior to departure date)

- “Sparschiene” tickets
- Valid only on the booked date and train
- Cannot be combined with other discounts
- Limited offer of saver tickets available
- Seat reservation required and not included (payable separately depending on the train)

## Booking

On validated travel days, holders of a Swiss Travel Pass (Flex) only need a ticket to the Swiss border (Buchs SG/St. Margrethen).
