### Services EuroCity

Accessible to 1st and 2nd class passengers

- Onboard restaurant, power outlets at the seat
- Free WLAN and SBB Onboard; only on SBB trains
- Family compartments; only available in 2nd class

Accessible exclusively to 1st class passengers

- Business and quiet zones only on SBB Giruno trains

### Ticket range EuroCity

Standard fare (Presale: 180 days prior to departure date)

- Valid only on the booked date and train
- Seat reservation required and included



### Saver fares: Smart and Smart 2

- Allotted low price offer with several price levels
- Smart: presale from 180 to 7 days prior to departure date, valid only on the booked date and train. Non-returnable and non-refundable
- Smart 2: presale 180 to 3 days prior to departure, flexible rebooking (date and/or train) against surcharge possible (balance payment to regular ticket), non-refundable
- Not offered on all routes. Seat reservation required and included. Cannot be combined with other discounts

### Booking

Guests who have a Swiss Travel System ticket receive discounts on the standard fare for long-distance cross-border services Italy–Switzerland. Global tickets are required, which also include a seat reservation.
