
# Grand Train Tour of Switzerland.

The Grand Train Tour of Switzerland combines all premium panoramic lines into one unique route. On a total of roughly 1,280 kilometres (795 miles), the highlights of Swiss public transport can be experienced throughout the year. Travellers can start at any given point along the route – there is no prescribed direction or duration. Best of all: The tour can be experienced with one single ticket, the Swiss Travel Pass.

Thanks to the routing across three mountain passes and through numerous valleys, the Grand Train Tour of Switzerland is perfect for combining bustling cities with scenic mountain regions.

# UNESCO World Heritage sites & top places of interest.

Switzerland is proud home to no fewer than an astounding twelve UNESCO World Heritage sites, eight of which are located along the Grand Train Tour of Switzerland. Among these are the terraced vineyards of the Lavaux, the Albula/Bernina Line of Rhaetian Railways, the castles of Bellinzona and the Abbey District of St. Gallen. Along the route, many other top sights and landmarks such as the Chapel Bridge in Lucerne, the Rhine Falls near Schaffhausen and the Matterhorn at Zermatt wait to be admired.





### Museums & castles.

Rainy days don't have to be dull! They are perfect for visiting one of the many Swiss museums or castles. Along the Grand Train Tour of Switzerland, travellers may visit the FIFA museum in Zurich, Chillon Castle near Montreux or the Zermatlantis Matterhorn Museum in Zermatt, as well as many more - all without paying extra entrance fees when holding a Swiss Travel Pass.

### Mountain excursions.

A journey through Switzerland without a mountain excursion? Unthinkable! A great number of mountain excursions can be comfortably combined with the Grand Train Tour of Switzerland. Whether on Europe's oldest cog railway up to Rigi, on the Gornergrat Railways with a perfect view of the Matterhorn or on a 125-year-old steam railway onto the Brienzer Rothorn: Most mountain railways offer a 50% discount to Swiss Travel Pass holders.
